

**Publication Agreement
for Contributions to *Fandom | Cultures | Research***

This publication agreement is concluded between:

the “author” of each published paper

and

****Fandom | Cultures | Research****
(hereinafter referred to as the “journal”).



Preamble

The author and the journal intend to make the scholarly contribution by the author publicly available in electronic form using the Open Journal Systems (hereinafter referred to as “OJS”) on the Marburg University Library’s publication server and to archive it permanently.

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The subject of this agreement is the work entitled **[Title of the contribution]**, hereinafter referred to as “submission.” The term “submission” used in this contract includes, without limitation, all materials related to the contribution delivered to the journal by or on behalf of the author. This applies to all components of the contribution (including text, graphical elements, tables, videos, and/or links), in whole or in part, and in all versions and forms of publication.

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The journal does not charge any fee for publishing with them.

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1. The journal shall provide editorial support, proofreading, layout, and technical preparation of the text as a PDF file. The journal agrees to present the work to the author for approval before publication.

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3. If the work is a scholarly article in the journal's main section, the editorial team will initiate a review process to ensure its academic and substantive quality. This process involves a review by independent experts and follows a double-blind process.

§ 6 Obligations of the Author

1. The author agrees to provide the necessary collaboration for the publication, including approving the edited version of the submission for publication and adhering to all set deadlines.
2. The author commits to producing the submission in accordance with academic standards, including accurate data, transparency of applied methods, and proper citation of any images used.
3. The submission may include links (e.g., frames or inline links) to supplementary media (e.g., additional documents, tables, charts, overviews, graphics, illustrations, animations, images, videos, and/or software) or to social interaction opportunities or technical features that enhance the work. These supplementary media may be hosted on the author's website or on a third-party server (e.g., hosted by an institution). However, the author must provide the journal with a list of such media and their respective sources (URLs) by the manuscript submission deadline. The journal reserves the right to reject, block, or delete any links to supplementary media, in whole or in part.

§ 7 Blocking or Rejection

1. The journal may forestall access to the submission if there are concrete indications of a violation of third-party rights. The author must be informed of the situation within a reasonable time and given the opportunity to rectify the violation.
2. If the submission is rejected, the journal will notify the author in writing. The agreement is thus concluded under the condition that the submission is free from technical or substantive issues.

§ 8 Submission and Formats

The author submits the work via the journal's OJS after registering. The journal provides a stylesheet in German and English as a PDF file. Images and graphics may be submitted in the following formats (in high resolution):

- JPEG
- PNG

§ 9 Data Protection

The journal, and the university library are considered joint data controllers under the GDPR for the electronic publication of the journal. Within this collaboration, the processing and storage of personal data is limited to what is necessary for the publication of an electronic journal. This includes, in particular, maintaining the user database within the OJS software with personal data of editors, reviewers, authors, and other parties involved. The joint controllers agree to support each other in complying with legal requirements.

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1. The invalidity or ineffectiveness of individual provisions of this agreement does not affect the validity of the remaining provisions. The parties shall replace any invalid provisions with terms that come closest to the economic and legal intent of the invalid terms. The same applies in the case of contractual gaps.
2. Amendments to this agreement must be made in writing. This also applies to amendments to the requirement of written form.
3. This agreement is governed by the laws of the Federal Republic of Germany. The place of jurisdiction is Marburg/Lahn.
